Author's debut *Debt* won the 1993 National Poetry Series. Throughout *Sound Fury*, poems by metaphysician Robert Herrick are refashioned into phantasmagorical oddities of likeness and difference. Figures from the fringes of popular imagination—Zane Grey, Robinson Crusoe, Porfirio Díaz—surface as cobbled- together avatars on the theme of identity.

Poet Mark Levine was raised in Toronto and educated at Brown University and the Iowa Writers' Workshop. His influential first book, *Debt*, many of whose poems first appeared in *The New Yorker*, was chosen for the 1993 National Poetry Series by Jorie Graham.
