German brothers Aurel and Arthur Krause were employed by the Geographical Society of Bremen when they conducted a nearly year-long study of the Tlingit people of Southeast Alaska. The late Dr. Erna Gunther was a professor of anthropology and director of the Washington State Museum at the University of Washington in Seattle. Her research of the native people of the Pacific Northwest spanned six decades.
